JFCNF Strategic Context



Changing Alliance: 30 members, three core tasks, out of area operations

Changing security environment: Dynamic, persistent, complex, and global threats.

Key summits: Wales (2014) and Warsaw (2016) push NATO to return to collective defense.

NCS-Adaptation: NATO Command Structure no longer "fit for purpose".

Key requirements: 360 degree situational awareness, warfighting capability, maritime posture, improved readiness and responsiveness.



JFCNF Establishment

NATO Brussels Summit (2018):

"Our new Joint Force Command will be based in Norfolk, Virginia (United States), ensuring the lines of communication between Europe and North America remain free and secure."



Key points:

- US-led, <u>Joint</u>, Operational-level HQ
- Combination of NFS and NCS
- Triple-hatted US Commander
- Permanent OPCOM to SACEUR
- Stood up in perfect alignment with current NATO strategic policies, concepts, and plans
- Declared FOC in June 2021





- The operational level is defined as the level at which campaigns and major operations are planned, conducted, and sustained to accomplish strategic objectives within theatres or areas of operations.
- The operational level links strategic objectives to tactical level operations. (AJP − 3)


